

Qatar National Research Fund (QNRF) Grants:

NATIONAL PRIORITIES RESEARCH PROGRAM – STANDARD (NPRP-S) Cycle 14th

The National Priorities Research Program (NPRP) is the main funding program of QNRF and the primary means by which QNRF seeks to support research that can help Qatar address Qatar Research, Development, and Innovation Strategy 2030 (link). The NPRP-S encourages collaborative proposals involving teams from more than one institution and sector. International collaboration is also welcome and is viewed as an important measure to enhance research capacity, transfer of knowledge, and scientific excellence in Qatar. However, and in order to ensure that such collaboration is effective, applicants need to provide a convincing justification for collaborating with international researchers and institutions. Collaboration, co-funding, and cost-sharing,

especially by research end-users (see definition at link) in proposals, are particularly favored, as they signify industrial relevance and inspire confidence in the uptake of their outcome by wider industrial and public sectors.

Application Launch: February 21, 2021

Application deadline: April 20, 2021 (noon, Doha time)

Amount/Duration: Based on type and duration of research (US\$180,000 – US\$630,000)/ Up to 4 years

Award Announcement: Dec 2021

The Doha International Family Institute (DIFI) and the Qatar National Research Fund (QNRF) have launched the OSRA research grant which is an annual research grant on Arab families and family policy related issues. The stimulus grant program will prioritize those who present a winning research context, including for example, mentorship, strong collaborators, and knowledge engagement partnerships.
