

Please allow the Research Office to help you get your grant application signed. All grant applications (including the signed <u>External Peer Review Feedback Forms</u> and <u>Research Funding Application Approval Form (RFAA)</u>) must be submitted to Research Office for Dean's signature and UC Research Office Services approval two weeks prior to the agency's deadlines.

Ideally, your application is completed 1.5 months prior to the agency deadline. This allows for peer review alterations in the grant and final signatures. Please review the updated <u>Research Grant Application Timeline</u>.

We are pleased to announce that our faculty are eligible to apply for the below grants:

VPR Catalyst Grant Sponsor: University of Calgary

VPR Catalyst Grants are designed to catalyze research initiatives that will lead to substantial external funding and are intended to support well-defined early-stage research activities. The VPR Catalyst Grants ask researchers to think boldly and strategically about how to maximize the impact of downstream funding. The stimulus grant program will prioritize those who present a winning research context, including for example, mentorship, strong collaborators, and knowledge engagement partnerships.

Application Deadline: 4 per year (Nov 15, Feb 15, May 15, Aug 15)
Amount/Duration: Maximum 12 months, after which unused funds must be returned
Value: CAD \$1,000 - \$15,000

Funded by the Provost's Office, the University of Calgary Teaching and Learning Grants are designed to enhance students' learning experiences through the integration of teaching, learning, and research. Specifically, they support the development, implementation, critical examination, and dissemination of innovative, evidence-based approaches to student learning in order to achieve the following goals:

- Integration of research evidence into teaching practice
- Generation of new knowledge about teaching and learning at the University of Calgary
- Dissemination of the results of that work to benefit others

SEED Grant Sponsor: University of Calgary in Qatar

The University of Calgary in Qatar Scholarly Seed Grant (SSG) was created in 2015 to strengthen faculty scholarship and research capacity. This funding initiative is aligned with Qatar National Vision (QNV) 2030 to create a knowledge economy in Qatar and the University of Calgary's Eyes High strategic vision, and the University of Calgary in Qatar Strategic Plan.

The purpose of the SSG is to foster faculty capacity by providing funding to conduct basic and applied research in teaching and learning, practice, tool development, translational research evaluation research, and systemrelated research with partners in the community. This funding is not provided for research limited to a review of the literature.

The SSG will offer one-time funding for up to CAD \$10,000. Examples of projects for which applicants can seek funding include:

a) Research aligned with the University of Calgary in Qatar strategic initiatives;

b) Research to examine current teaching and learning and clinical practices;

c) Pilot studies that can support larger grants (example: tool development); and

d) Additional types of research directed at the National Health Strategy 2018-2022, Qatar National Research Strategy (QNRS) 2013, and QNRS 2014 (link).

Amount/Duration: Up to CAD\$10,000/ 2 year

Undergraduate Research Experience Program (UREP) Sponsor: Qatar national research Fund (QNRF)

The Undergraduate Research Experience Program (UREP) is one of the main programs offered by QNRF and designed to fulfill its aims in developing research infrastructure in Qatar by establishing the basis of scientific research at the undergraduate level. UREP provides a great opportunity for undergraduate students to experience scientific research and to engage in the various processes to build skills essential for the professional development of the students.

Application Launch: Nov 2, 2020
Application deadline: Feb 1, 2021
Amount/Duration: up to US\$30,000 (US\$5000/student)/ 1 year
Award Announcement: May 2021

High School Research Experience Program (HSREP) Sponsor: Qatar National Research Fund

The High School Research Experience Program (HSREP) aims to foster a research culture and develop research capacity in Qatar by promoting "Learning by Doing" and "Hands-On" research activities as effective methods for high school education. Students will gain experience in research with academic mentors throughout their one-year involvement in the HSREP grant. HSREP grant will also indirectly support, promote, and foster STEM education in schools. HSREP is designed specially for high school students in line with QNRF's mission of supporting original research across all levels. This program aims to build a solid research foundation in students before they pursue their undergraduate studies by introducing them to research design and methodologies in various disciplines. HSREP aims to play an important role in QNRF's aim of building the local human capacity in Qatar and providing local organizations and institutions with a steady supply of skilled graduates.
