When is Ethics Approval Required for a Research Project?

Ethics approval for research is required when the study involves human subjects, animals, or the use of personal data. The primary purpose of ethics approval is to ensure that the research is conducted in an ethical and responsible manner, with the safety, rights, and well-being of the participants and the public in mind.

As per <u>Tri-Council Policy Statement (TCPS)</u>, <u>Belmont Report</u>, <u>US NIH</u>, research involving living human participants or human biological materials, embryos, fetuses, fetal tissue, reproductive materials, and stem cells requires ethics review and approval by an Institutional Review Board before the research commences.

The requirements for obtaining ethics approval may vary depending on the country, institution, and type of research. In Qatar, differentiating between research and innovation grants and teaching and learning can be complex or confusing for researchers. If in doubt, please contact the Research Office at roshi.taleghani@ucalgary.ca.

The University of Calgary in Qatar (UCQ) has an Assurance agreement with the Ministry of Public Health (MOPH) in Qatar. UCQ ensures that all of its human subjects research activities, regardless of the source of support, will be guided by the ethical principles in the following documents:

Tri-Council Policy Statement (TCPS),

Belmont Report,

US NIH

To ensure compliance with MOPH regulations, any research or data collection involving human subjects, whether carried out in classrooms or other contexts, necessitates obtaining an Ethics certificate.

Additionally, it is imperative to inform the UCQ Research Office of such activities.

High School Research Experience Program (HSREP)

Sponsor: Qatar Research Development and Innovation (QRDI)/QNRF

The High School Research Experience Program (HSREP) aims to foster a research culture and develop research capacity in Qatar by promoting "Learning by Doing" and "Hands-On" research activities as effective methods for high school education. Students will gain experience in research with academic mentors throughout their one-year involvement in the HSREP grant. HSREP grant will also indirectly support, promote, and foster STEM education in schools. HSREP is designed specifically for high school students in line with QNRF's mission of supporting original research across all levels. This program aims to build a solid research foundation in students before they pursue their undergraduate studies by introducing them to research design and methodologies in various disciplines. HSREP aims to play an important role in QNRF's aim of building the local human capacity in Qatar and providing local organizations and institutions with a steady supply of skilled graduates.

Budget: Funds will be managed by the awarded institution. HSREP award is for one calendar year and QAR 18,000.

Program for Undergraduate Research Experience (PURE)

Sponsor: University of Calgary

The Program for Undergraduate Research Experience (PURE) provides up to \$7,500 of financial support to undergraduates to conduct research for 8, 12 or 16 weeks between May and August. Since UCQ summer schedule is different with main campus. Qatar Students are only allowed to apply to conduct research for 8 weeks.

The PURE program makes it possible for students to learn from on-campus experts about how research projects are developed, and how their results can contribute to new knowledge while solving problems in society. Each PURE learning experience is a unique opportunity to develop research skills and explore research interests. These experiences help students develop the abilities to collaborate, communicate, and think critically and creatively. PURE enriches and extends undergraduate learning outside the classroom. Taylor Institute for Teaching and Learning (SoTL grant)

Sponsor: University of Calgary

Funded by the Provost's Office, the University of Calgary Teaching and Learning Grants are designed to enhance student's learning experiences through the integration of teaching, learning, and research. Specifically, they support the development, implementation, critical examination, and dissemination of innovative, evidence-based approaches to student learning in order to achieve the following goals:

- Integration of research evidence into teaching practice
- Generation of new knowledge about teaching and learning at the University of Calgary
- Dissemination of the results of that work to benefit others

Amount/Duration: Based on type and duration of research (CAD\$ 10,000 - 40,000)/ Up to 3 years

Application deadline: Monday, January 15, 2024

Undergraduate Research Experience Program (UREP)

Sponsor: Qatar Research Development and Innovation (QRDI)/QNRF

UREP offers students and mentors opportunities to build their research experience and portfolios, especially in the QRDI national areas at link. After participating in a UREP project, students can become potentially strong candidates for other QRDI funding programs in the future, and mentors can build their research programs while simultaneously supporting student development and personal growth.

Duration: One-year award for a total of QAR 18,000 per student (maximum 6 students) as follows:

Eligibility of applicant (PRM):

- Must be affiliated with a submitting institution in Qatar
- Must hold a research-oriented doctorate or any of the approved terminal degrees as defined by the list of terminal degrees.
- If the PRM does not hold a terminal degree, they must collaborate with an RM or industry mentor who do.
- PRMs and RMs may participate in up to two UREP projects per cycle and three overall.

Eligibility of Students:

- Must be enrolled as full-time students in an undergraduate degree program in an educational institution or university in Qatar.
- Must remain residents in Qatar throughout the project.
- Student-to Mentor ratio not to exceed 3:1

Graduate Sponsorship Research Award (GSRA)

Sponsor: Qatar Research Development and Innovation (QRDI)/QNRF

GSRA enables local eligible institutions to support prospective faculty and researchers through a competitive sponsorship program. Graduate candidates will gain the knowledge, skills, and experience necessary to become future research and development leaders in Qatar. The program provides sponsorships to undertake research-based graduate studies towards masters or doctoral degrees through two tracks: GSRA local and GSRA international.

Eligibility of Candidates

- Candidates must not exceed 40 years of age at the time of submission.
- GSRA candidate should be an employee. An employment letter (commitment confirmation from the employer) to that effect should be included in the submission.
- GSRA candidates must be accepted to full-time programs of study. Online and/or part-time programs are disallowed. A full or provisional acceptance letter should be included in the submission.
- GSRA will not support an application for an equivalent or lower degree than the one currently held by the candidate.
- GSRA will not support candidates who have already started their study programs prior to the submission deadline.
- GSRA will only accept applications for programs that start in the following academic year.
- Local track candidates are only allowed to study at universities in Qatar.
- GSRA International track supports Qatari nationals and those of Qatari mothers.
- GSRA international track supports study programs at approved universities outside Qatar. A list of approved universities is provided in Appendix 1 in the request for application document.
